Welcome to another week in the life of Eastleigh Parish Church!



How well do you know today's Bible passage? For many people, Romans 8 is like the 'Crown Jewels' of the Scriptures and have been a source of help and encouragement — especially at times of great challenge and hardship in the Christian life. If you've never learned a large passage of Scripture off-by-heart before, why not have a go at learning today's reading? It may prove to be one the best investments of time and effort you'll ever make!

Both of today's church services have been pre-recorded – so you can have a lie-in and still be on time without anyone knowing just how long you have slept for.

Bible Reading

Romans 8:26-39 (NIRV)

²⁶ In the same way, the Holy Spirit helps us when we are weak. We don't know what we should pray for. But the Spirit himself prays for us. He prays through groans too deep for words. ²⁷ God, who looks into our hearts, knows the mind of the Spirit. And the Spirit prays for God's people just as God wants him to pray.

²⁸ We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him. He appointed them to be saved in keeping with his purpose. ²⁹ God planned that those he had chosen would become like his Son. In that way, Christ will be the first and most honoured among many brothers and sisters. ³⁰ And those God has

planned for, he has also appointed to be saved. Those he has appointed, he has made right with himself. To those he has made right with himself, he has given his glory.

³¹ What should we say then? Since God is on our side, who can be against us? ³² God did not spare his own Son. He gave him up for us all. Then won't he also freely give us everything else? ³³ Who can bring any charge against God's chosen ones? God makes us right with himself. ³⁴ Then who can sentence us to death? No one. Christ Jesus is at the right hand of God and is also praying for us. He died. More than that, he was raised to life. ³⁵ Who can separate us from Christ's love? Can trouble or hard times or harm or hunger? Can nakedness or danger or war? ³⁶ It is written,

"Because of you, we face death all day long.

We are considered as sheep to be killed." (Psalm 44:22)

³⁷ No! In all these things we are more than winners! We owe it all to Christ, who has loved us. ³⁸ I am absolutely sure that not even death or life can separate us from God's love. Not even angels or demons, the present or the future, or any powers can separate us. ³⁹ Not even the highest places or the lowest, or anything else in all creation can separate us. Nothing at all can ever separate us from God's love. That's because of what Christ Jesus our Lord has done.

Key Prayer Point for this Week



On Wednesday, Sue, Phil & Adrian will be interviewing a very promising candidate for the post of 'Youth & Children's Minister'. Please will you pray for the following?

- For the interview team to clearly discern God's will for EPC that would be blessed with wisdom
- For the candidate, that this process would be a blessing to them –
 whatever the outcome may be
- That God would appoint the most marvellous person to lead our ministry with children & young people
- That EPC would now see a wonderful new season of ministry to-and-with children & young people and their families

You'll notice that we have changed the job title from 'Children & Families Minister'. There's a good reason for this. Whilst the main focus of this job will be to encourage parents and carers to disciple their own children (rather than simply relying on church-based activities like Sunday School), this particular candidate has a gifting in the area of working with older young people. Having had some preliminary conversations with the applicant, we think that it is right in this instance to broaden the age-range of the work that they would lead should they be appointed.

Reopening the Church Building: The PCC's Plan



Thank you for all of your prayers and helpful feedback on this topic. The PCC had a very fruitful conversation when we met last week and fairly swiftly reached a unanimous decision on how to proceed at this time.

Some of the main points we wanted to incorporate into our plans included:

 A desire to ensure that those who are unable to return to the church building who do not have internet access continue to have the option of attending the 9am telephone service.

- A recognition that there are some very good reasons why not everyone is able to return to the building at this time.
- We mustn't give the impression that attending online or in person is somehow 'better than' or 'less than' the other when genuine reasons keep us apart from others at this time.
- We noted that it is very disappointing that our insurers, acting on the advice of the CoE authorities, won't allow us to share wine as a part of Holy Communion (even though government guidance would have permitted this!).
- Whilst Sunday services are helpful, being a part of a weekly Discipleship Group is very beneficial to Christian growth.

This is the unanimous decision that the PCC made:

The church building will reopen for worship in August. Once All Saints' reopens on 9th August:

- 1. The telephone service will continue to be provided at 9am each Sunday until further notice.
- 2. There will be one service at 10:30am each Sunday that can be accessed both online AND in person.
- 3. We will review the situation and make plans beyond August in due course.

Below is a table to summarise what we plan for the next month, but in short, rather than offering 10am & 11o'clock services via ZOOM/Facebook, from August 9th we will hold <u>one</u> main service that can be accessed both online and in person. Some contributors to the service (e.g. prayers, readings, etc.) will be in-person, whilst others will be online.

Before we open the church building for worship you will receive a special email detailing what to expect if/when you attend in person during August. Dave Savage has led the preparation of an excellent Health & Safety Risk Assessment for using the church building. As you might expect, this plan includes hand gel, a one-way system for moving around the building, new signage, etc. We will be careful to incorporate all new guidance as it emerges. We now know that face coverings should be worn when attending (N.B. some people are exempt from wearing face coverings. See government advice for full details).




