Welcome to Outlook, the weekly newsletter for Eastleigh Parish Church

In recent weeks we've been thinking about the Church. In particular, we've been keen to take a look at what Paul's letter to the Ephesians teaches us about the Church. Last Sunday Ian talked about 'the Jesus-shaped Church' (with Jesus as the chief cornerstone; Eph 2:22). When you sit quietly to pray and read your Bible this week, why not take a few minutes to see what you notice about the shape of the community of disciples that Jesus built during His 3 years of public ministry? You could read any of the 4 Gospels to gain an insight into this, but you may like to start with some fascinating passages in Matthew such as:

• Matthew 8:23-27; 10:1-20; 13:47-52; 16:21-28; 28:1-10, and; 28:16-20.

Don't forget: As disciples of Jesus, we want to see Eastleigh Parish Church reflecting all that Jesus hoped to see in His Church. Having read these or other Scriptures you might find it helpful to jot down a few key thoughts or even a goal that you'd like to pursue.

For the next 2 Sundays (20th & 27th) our readings are going to give us a cosmic view of the Church! These perspectives of what the Church is and what the Church is for are crucial for us to grasp if we are ever to gain the same view of the Church that God Himself has.



Bible Reading 20th September

Ephesians 3:7-19

⁷ I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power. ⁸ Although I am less than the least of all the Lord's people, this grace was given me: to preach to the Gentiles the boundless riches of Christ, ⁹ and to make plain to everyone the administration of this mystery, which for ages past was kept hidden in God, who created all things. ¹⁰ His intent was that now, through the church, the manifold wisdom of God should be made known to the rulers and authorities in the heavenly realms, ¹¹ according to his eternal purpose that he accomplished in Christ Jesus our Lord. ¹² In him and through faith in him we may approach God with freedom and confidence. ¹³ I ask you, therefore, not to be discouraged because of my sufferings for you, which are your glory.

¹⁴ For this reason I kneel before the Father, ¹⁵ from whom every family in heaven and on earth derives its name. ¹⁶ I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, ¹⁷ so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, ¹⁸ may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, ¹⁹ and to know this love that surpasses knowledge – that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

Further Update on Noah from Naomi & Luis (Noah's mum & dad, EPC mission partners):



"Hello again,

Noah had his appointment to get the biopsy results and talk about his surgery. Due to some kind of error, they were unable to obtain results, so they will have to repeat the biopsy on Monday. These results will determine whether he is able to have the transplant or if he'll need more chemo first.

He has the go ahead for surgery on Wednesday 23rd Sept and will be admitted the evening before, for a blood transfusion and prep for the operation.

The surgeon said that Noah's primary tumour has improved considerably in comparison to the first images and she is pleased at how well he has responded to the chemotherapy, praise God!

The other good news is that we found out there's no cancer in the peripheral blood!

For prayer:

- For God to use the surgeon!
- That they will be able to remove the tumour alone and won't have to touch his left kidney.
- Good health leading up to the surgery.
- Protection from Covid in the operating theatre.


Whole-Church 24hrs of Fasting/Prayer

Sundays in October?



It has been really good to be able to meet outside St Francis' at 11am and also in the All Saints' building/online at 9:30am on Sundays during September. As we now move towards October, we need to start thinking about planning for cooler weather.

As before, we're going to continue making short term plans for our Sunday gatherings

based on the most up-to-date government information available at the time (which seems to be constantly evolving). This means that we will announce our plan for Sundays in October in the days leading up to the 1st weekend.

It is possible that we'll need to think creatively about appropriate ventilation at All Saints' once the temperature drops and it is no longer feasible to leave the doors wide open. Likewise, it is possible that we'll lay out 2 different sets of chairs for Sundays – one for 9:30 and the other for 11am (which would allow us to use the building twice in a day without needing to clean all the chairs between users).


